
The wireless remote control can be used to lock and unlock the vehicle and the back door from outside the vehicle.



- Locks all doors
- 2 Unlocks all doors

Pressing the button unlocks the driver's door. Pressing the button again within 3 seconds unlocks the other doors.

- Operates remote air conditioning system (if equipped)
 (→P. 285)
- 4 Sounds alarm (push and hold) (→P. 64)

n Operation signals

A buzzer sounds and the emergency flashers flash to indicate that the doors have been locked/unlocked. (Locked: Once; Unlocked: Twice)

n Panic mode



When (() is pushed for longer than about one second, an alarm will sound for about 60 seconds and the vehicle lights will flash to deter any person from trying to break into or damage your vehicle.

To stop the alarm, push any button on the wireless remote control.

n Door lock buzzer (vehicles with entry function)

If a door or back door is not fully closed, a buzzer sounds continuously for 10 seconds if an attempt to lock the door is made. Fully close the door to stop the buzzer, and lock the vehicle once more.

n Electronic key battery depletion

- 1 The standard battery life is 1 to 2 years. (The battery becomes depleted even if the electronic key is not used.) If the smart key system or the wireless remote control function does not operate, or the detection area becomes smaller, the battery may be depleted. Replace the battery when necessary. (→ P. 452)
- 1 To avoid serious deterioration, do not leave the electronic key within 3 ft. (1 m) of the following electrical appliance that produce a magnetic field.
 - TVs
 - · Personal computers
 - · Cellular phones, cordless phones and battery chargers
 - Recharging cellular phones or cordless phones
 - · Glass top ranges
 - Table lamps

n Conditions affecting operation

The smart key system and wireless remote control use weak radio waves. In the following situations, the communication between the electronic key and the vehicle may be affected, preventing the smart key system and wireless remote control from operating properly. (Ways of coping: →P. 533)

- 1 When the electronic key battery is depleted
- Near a TV tower, electric power plant, gas station, radio station, large display, airport or other facility that generates strong radio waves or electrical noise
- 1 When carrying a portable radio, cellular phone, cordless phone or other wireless communication devices
- 1 When the electronic key is in contact with, or is covered by the following metallic objects
 - · Cards to which aluminum foil is attached
 - · Cigarette boxes that have aluminum foil inside
 - · Metallic wallets or bags
 - Coins
 - Hand warmers made of metal.
 - · Media such as CDs and DVDs
- 1 When multiple electronic keys are in the vicinity
- 1 When carrying or using the electronic key together with the following devices that emit radio waves
 - · Another vehicle's electronic key
 - · A wireless key that emits radio waves
 - · Personal computer
 - Digital audio players
 - · Portable game systems
- If window tint with a metallic content or metallic objects are attached to the rear window (vehicles with entry function)

n Security feature

If a door is not opened within approximately 60 seconds after the vehicle is unlocked, the security feature automatically locks the vehicle again.

n If the wireless remote control does not operate properly

- 1 Locking and unlocking the doors: Use the mechanical key. (\rightarrow P. 533)
- Starting the hybrid system (→P. 162)

n When the electronic key battery is fully depleted

n Customization that can be configured at Toyota dealer

Settings (e.g. 2-step unlocking function) can be changed. (Customizable features →P. 579)

The vehicle can be locked and unlocked using the entry function, wireless remote control or door lock switch.




The doors can also be locked and unlocked with the mechanical key. (\rightarrow P. 533)

The front doors can be opened by pulling the inside handles even if the lock buttons are in the lock position.

Locking the front doors from the outside without a key


STEP 1 Move the inside lock button to the lock position.

STEP 2 Close the door.

The door cannot be locked if the "POWER" switch is in ACCESSORY or ON mode, or the electronic key is left inside the vehicle.

Depending on the position of the electronic key, the key may not be detected correctly and the door may be locked.

Rear door child-protector lock



The door cannot be opened from inside the vehicle when the locks are set.

These locks can be set to prevent children from opening the rear doors. Push down on each rear door switch to lock both rear doors.

Automatic door locking and unlocking systems


The following functions can be set or canceled:

Function	Operation
Shift position linked door locking function	Shifting the shift position out of "P" locks all doors.
Shift position linked door unlocking function	Shifting the shift position to "P" unlocks all doors.
Speed linked door lock- ing function	All doors are locked when the vehicle speed is approximately 12 mph (20 km/h) or higher.
Driver's door linked door unlocking function	All doors are unlocked when the driver's door is opened within 10 seconds after turning the "POWER" switch OFF.

n Setting and canceling the functions

To switch between setting and canceling, follow the procedure below:

Close all the doors and switch the "POWER" switch to ON mode. (Perform STEP 2 within 20 seconds.)



Shift the shift lever to "N" or press "P" position switch, and press and hold the driver's door lock switch (or) for about 5 seconds then release.

The shift and switch positions corresponding to the desired function to be set are shown as follows.

Use the same procedure to cancel the function.

Function	Shift position	Driver's door lock switch position
Shift position linked door locking function	"D"	a

Speed linked door locking function	"N"	a
Driver's door linked door unlocking function	IV.	ū

When the setting or canceling operation is complete, all doors are locked and then unlocked.

n Using the mechanical key

A CAUTION

n To prevent an accident

Observe the following precautions while driving the vehicle. Failing to do so may result in a door opening and an occupant falling out, resulting in death or serious injury.


- 1 Always use a seat belt.
- 1 Always lock all doors.
- 1 Ensure that all doors are properly closed.
- Do not pull the inside handle of the doors while driving.
 The doors may be opened and the passengers are thrown out of the vehi
 - cle and it may result in death or serious injury.

 Be especially careful for the front doors, the door may be opened even if the inside lock button is in locked position.
- 1 Set the rear door child protector locks when children are seated in the rear seat.

1-3. Opening, closing and locking the doors and back door Back door


The back door can be locked/unlocked and opened by the following procedures.



n When closing the back door




Lower the back door using the back door handles, and make sure to push the back door down from the outside to close it.


Be careful not to pull the back door sideways when closing the back door with the handle.

n If the back door opener is inoperative

The back door can be opened from the inside.



Remove the cover.



Move the lever.

A CAUTION

n While driving

- 1 Keep the back door closed while driving. If the back door is left open, it may hit near-by objects while driving or luggage may be unexpectedly thrown out, causing an accident. In addition, exhaust gases may enter the vehicle, causing death or a serious health hazard. Make sure to close the back door before driving.
- 1 Before driving the vehicle, make sure that the back door is fully closed. If the back door is not fully closed, it may open unexpectedly while driving, causing an accident.
- 1 Never let anyone sit in the luggage compartment. In the event of sudden braking or a collision, they are susceptible to death or serious injury.

n When children are in the vehicle

Observe the following precautions.

Failure to do so may result in death or serious injury.

- 1 Do not leave children alone in the luggage compartment. If a child is accidentally locked in the luggage compartment, they could overheat.
- 1 Do not allow a child to open or close the back door. Doing so may cause the back door to operate unexpectedly, or cause the child's hands, head, or neck to be caught by the closing back door.

CAUTION

n Operating the back door

Observe the following precautions.

Failure to do so may cause parts of the body to be caught, resulting in serious injury.

- Remove any heavy loads, such as snow and ice, from the back door before opening it. Failure to do so may cause the back door fall closed again after it is opened.
- 1 When opening or closing the back door, thoroughly check to make sure the surrounding area is safe.
- 1 If anyone is in the vicinity, make sure they are safe and let them know that the back door is about to open or close.
- 1 Use caution when opening or closing the back door in windy weather as it may move abruptly in strong wind.



1 The back door may fall if it is not opened fully. It is more difficult to open or close the back door on an incline than on a level surface, so beware of the back door unexpectedly opening or closing by itself. Make sure that the back door is fully open and secure before using the luggage compartment.

A CAUTION



- 1 When closing the back door, take extra care to prevent your fingers etc. from being caught.
- 1 When closing the back door, make sure to press it lightly on its outer surface. If the back door handle is used to fully close the back door, it may result in hands or arms being caught.
- 1 Do not pull on the back door damper stay to close the back door, and do not hang on the back door damper stay. Doing so may cause hands to be caught or the back door damper stay to break, causing an accident.
- 1 Do not attach any accessories other than genuine Toyota parts to the back door. Such additional weight on the back door may cause the back door to fall closed again after it is opened.


NOTICE

n Back door damper stays

The back door is equipped with damper stays that hold the back door in place.

Observe the following precautions.

Failure to do so may cause damage to the back door damper stay, resulting in malfunction.



- Do not attach any foreign objects, such as strikers, plastic sheets, or adhesives to the damper stay rod.
- 1 Do not touch the damper stay rod with gloves or other fabric items.
- Do not attach any accessories other than genuine Toyota parts to the back door.
- Do not place your hand on the damper stay or apply lateral forces to it.
